Chairman Chitty opened the meeting of the Parrish Fire Commission.

The minutes of the previous meeting held May 25, 2021, were approved on a motion by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Combee, and carried by a vote of 4-0.

Chairman Chitty called for public comment no one signed up to speak.

Commissioner Dirling presented the updates on the By-Laws for the Manatee County Fire Commissioners Assoc. Commissioner Webb made a motion to approve the changes for the By-Laws for the Manatee County Fire Commissioners Assoc, seconded by Commissioner Combee and carried by a vote of 4-0.

Chief Bailey advised the Board on updates for station 2. They were now trying to finalize the amount of the loan from Center State Bank and USDA, that we can receive. Site plans have been submitted to the county for station 2. Willis Smith should have the GMP ready for a presentation at next months meeting.

The financial report for month ending May 2021 was presented. Chief Bailey indicated that the general fund is doing well, we are still waiting for some money to come in, expenditures are being slowed down. Impact fee revenue is currently at \$394,534.80, with an additional funds of \$194,534.80 The financial report was approved on a motion by Commissioner Dirling, seconded by Commissioner Webb and carried by a vote of 4-0.

In the administration report, Chief Bailey brought up many different items, working on Station 2, Prebudget planning, ALS Planning and Research, and cost increases for the budget.

Commissioner Dirling – Thanked everyone for approving the By-Laws

Commissioner Combee – Thanked Chief Bailey and his staff along with the firefighters for all the hard work going on around here.

Commissioner Webb – Would like a updated roster so he could put names with faces, also brought up that he received a call from Brian who lives across from Station 2 site, that he was concerned that the trucks would be using sirens late at night if they received a call. Chief Bailey advised Commissioner Webb that many departments have a policy in place that the guys don't use the sirens at night, unless absolutely necessary.

Commissioner Chitty - Thanked Chief Bailey and everyone for all their hard work being done.
